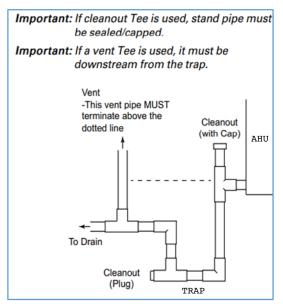

TECHNICIAN'S CORNER

BASICS OF CONDENSATE DRAINS

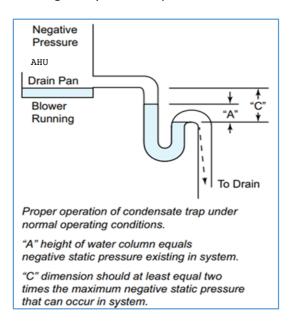

One of our most common service calls: the blocked drain. The call can come in disguised as a no cool, blank thermostat or even property damage. In any case the drain is often thought of as a simple thing and sometimes regarded with little concern. The drain system must be installed and maintained correctly.



When discussing installation; drains should have 1/4" drop per foot (1" per foot). In addition to the drop ratio we must be mindful of the traps, cleanouts and vents. Many manufacturers will state in their Installer's Guide on the placement and size of the trap. The trap is suggested by most to be installed close to the air handler rather than outside, away from the air handler. There is some confusion amongst the techs I speak with about the difference between a cleanout and a trap. The difference is function and placement. A clean out (image to the left) is installed between the trap and the air handler. The cleanout must be capped to allow for proper drainage. A vent is placed after the trap (or between two traps if necessary), it must be open to the atmosphere and rise above the air handler drain connection. Always keep in mind water is self-leveling, if the vent is not above the primary drain pan water can come out of that vent.

The trap itself must be sized properly. As seen in the image (below) the size of the trap is dependent on static pressure; the purpose of the trap is to overcome the negative pressure associated with the return side of the air handler, this "pull" is also seen in the drain, thus the trap. This does not apply to positive pressure cabinets. Traps can be created un-expectantly or over time. This can occur in long, poorly supported drains causing "bellys" or low points which creates a running trap. A drain system cannot have multiple traps, this



will create an air-lock and prevent proper drainage. We should take care when installing the drain system and address these items before they cause a problem. While I've included some images from only one manufacturer, please check the installers guide for the specific brand you are installing; make sure that manufacturer does not have a specific requirement.

In addition to the installation, we should discuss preventative maintenance. As an industry we have noticed an increase in "drain calls" since we moved to all aluminum evaporator coils. I'm not saying that aluminum coils are worse than copper by any means. What we should recognize is the difference; one of those is that copper is a natural anti-microbial and aluminum is not. This being the case all aluminum coils can develop microbial growth faster than a copper coil; which leads to blocked drains. In addition the microbial aspect we must understand that the

aluminum header on the evaporator coil is not a "carrying handle" even though it's convenient to use it as one. I can say with almost certainty that using the suction header to carry the coil will result in a leaking coil. (I know, not really a drain concern, but it seems relevant to the topic).

TECHNICIAN'S CORNER CONT.

Cleaning drains is critical to the maintenance call. There are many products in the market to use; however, there are some common points. The high strength acidic formulas should not be poured directly into the drain pan, apply it to the drain line cleanout. Follow the manufacturer's directions and safety protocols calls when using these types of products. An alternative can be warm water poured directly in the air handler drain pan. While the warm water is in the drain system have your wet-dry vac outside attached to help pull out the warm water and the other "stuff" inside the line. Remember only pure water (H_20) evaporates, everything else in the water stays behind, scale, sediment, microbial growth etc... The coils are also part of the equation, clean them thoroughly as what drips off the coils goes into the drain. When the primary pan has drained out completely, clean the pan with the vac or a rag. Pay close attention to the drain connection, while it's a ¾" connection the opening is smaller than ¾" which can be easily blocked with growth or debris. I've heard of some contractors using 1" PVC drain instead of ¾" which is not a bad idea; don't forget about the air handler drain connection. It's a still ¾" and a potential blockage point.

When cleaning the drain please use caution by not attaching a garden hose to the drain termination point outside (sending water from the outside to the inside). Running pressurized water in the drain line can cause older glue joints to come apart sending water to the most inconvenient area (inside a wall, over an expensive piece of furniture etc...). Or simply by overflowing the primary drain pan; either way this can turn out to be a costly mistake. This is a good time to remind us that PVC glue can and does dry out over time, using pressure of any kind (CO₂, nitrogen, water) may cause an elbow or coupling to separate. The next consideration is pan tabs. While useful, we should not blindly throw a handful of tablets in the primary pan. This can cause a blocked drain at the connection point.



I feel it's an important reminder for those of us performing preventative maintenance calls; don't be tempted to take the short cut. Of course, follow your company's guidelines, but make sure you are taking off the covers and cleaning the inside, a proper drain cleaning isn't just attaching the wetdry vac to the termination of the drain. Check pitch, traps, connection points, float safety switches in addition to all the other maintenance points on your checklist. Float safety switches should be checked for function as well as application, are they installed in the correct location and pitched correctly? Something as simple as a drain can lead to costly property damage as seen in the image here.

This article mostly addresses residential style units; although, many concepts are similar in commercial units except for the size of the drain.

One lesson I learned early, always watch the drain flow naturally after you complete your work. Unfortunately I got this one the hard way. Many years ago I started up a system, once the charge was set I cleaned up and headed home – didn't verify the drain. Yep, you guessed it, there was a problem with the drain. While this only caused minor damage, it's something I still carry with me today. Please stay safe in all you do; from driving to ladder work to crawling around an attic!

Why Developing Your Own Talent is the Best Strategy for Your HVAC Company

Finding, training, and retaining good HVAC technicians is one of the most important issues an owner has to deal with. Without good people, your business can't grow, and might start to decline. So talent management is job one. If you're an owner who thinks about hiring only when someone quits, you're probably under a lot of stress. There might be a better way.

Most owners are reactive about hiring. When someone quits, they go all out to find a qualified technician that can start right away. The problem is, that unicorn doesn't exist. The number of highly qualified HVAC techs with great work ethic sitting around unemployed is exactly: zero. The best workers are happily employed at your competitor's companies. That means the ones looking for work are probably not the best of the best unless they're brand new out of school or new in town. If a worker has experience, but isn't already working, you may just be hiring someone else's former problem.

And you might not know that right away. A tech with years of experience may not be reliable. He may not have what it takes to do quality work on the new technology. He may have acquired years of sloppy work habits. You won't necessarily know until you start getting calls from customers whose repairs didn't fix a problem or whose new systems aren't working like they should. Now you're wasting your best guy's valuable time fixing problems for free.

Here's a proactive way to avoid that situation: develop your own talent in house. It's not a quick fix by any means; you'll be investing time, energy, and money for months before the tech is ready to work on his own, But you may avoid having to settle for the first available tech off the street when you have a vacancy.

I've seen this work well in several companies. Here's what they've done.

First, the owner has to **develop a training system** that's skills-based and designed to bring someone along according to a careful plan. Break down the job of a technician into specific skills that can be taught in a few months. You'll be creating a system that gives your experienced techs a helper who will learn skills on the job. The first few months, he'll assist with installations, learning about the equipment, tools, and processes. Once your experienced tech confirms he's got the mechanical ability and is a good worker, you can consider sending him to a trade school to get the formal education and certification.

It's important to **have a written plan** that includes incentives for achieving goals during the training. You can start workers at a lower, learning wage, but you'll need to provide raises when they master skills. Having a well-defined career path with potential for earning more will keep your trainees motivated.

Next, **look for young people with the right attitude.** You can find them through friends and family or by approaching workers who have impressed you where you shop or do business. Ask around to see if anyone knows a person with mechanical ability who's interested in building a trade and a well-paying career. You can find hard workers at retail stores, working construction, just about any entry-level job. Remember that aside from some mechanical aptitude, the main thing you're looking for is a worker who's reliable and willing to learn. Hire for attitude; you can teach the skills.

This kind of training program won't yield immediate results; it will be months before your trainee will be able to handle calls on his own. But you'll be getting a good idea of what kind of worker he is along the way and building a relationship. You will create an employee who believes in your system and does things the way you want them done. No need to un-teach any bad habits. He'll be more loyal to a company that believed in him and invested in him.

If you're a sports fan, you know that the best teams have a deep bench. They have their star players mentoring rookies with potential, helping them perfect their skills and get the benefit of their experience. When you have a system that develops your own talent, you don't have to worry when someone leaves. Instead of scrambling to make a last-minute hire, you'll have a rookie who's ready to go into the game.

You'll even gain value from the salary you're paying the trainee as he learns. When your experienced tech has someone to do the routine tasks, he'll be able to spend his time, energy, and full attention on the important, complex parts of the job. You'll also become a talent magnet as word gets around that you develop hard workers into skilled tradesmen. Recruiting trainees will get easier when you develop that reputation.

If you're wondering when to get started, **the time to hire is when you don't need the help.** Your investment in your bench team will make your job as an owner less stressful and make your whole team stronger in the long run.

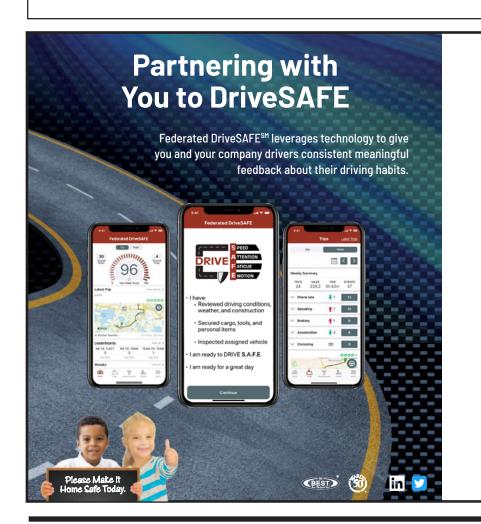

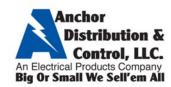
