Head Pressure By Kevin Perron

TECHNICIAN'S CORNER

A couple of times a year here in south Florida, we have what the rest of the country might say is a "cool day," while we Floridians typically use the term "freezing," and on those days. We are reminded of a few controls in some systems that don't come into play the other 363 days. Those controls are the ones needed to maintain minimum head pressure. During the warmer months, we tend to work on keeping the head pressure down to maintain efficiency and longevity, but when it's cold out, the tables turn. Why do we have to maintain the minimum head pressure? The answer is to ensure proper refrigerant flow through our metering devices. TXVs, in general, require about 100-125 #s of pressure difference from the inlet side to the outlet to perform properly. Though some can maintain superheat with less pressure difference it's still very important. Too little pressure drop results in insufficient capacity and often wild swings in superheat. Too little of a pressure differential can be the result of low head pressure which occurs those couple of days I'm speaking of.

There are several ways to maintain sufficient head pressure, a few examples are the fan cycle control, a discharge bypass valve (also referred to as a Headmaster) or a simple thermostat.

Fan cycle control. This control is typically a simple pressure control that opens the electrical circuit to the condenser fan motor when the head pressure drops below the minimum requirement, forcing the head pressure back up into the correct operating range where the circuit will close again. This is sufficient control during mildly cool days but may not be enough when it's extremely cold. This control may be found on some air conditioners and lots of refrigeration equipment. The downside to this type of control is that the cycling of the condenser fan motor can shorten the life of the motor and the limited range of effectiveness as it may only be effective down to 50°f or so. We need to check the condenser fan; it needs to be a ball bearing type when used with this control. The upside to this one is the cost for sure.

Less often the use of a simple thermostat that is wired to open the circuit to a condenser fan motor as with the pressure control above. However, this control is simply sensing the ambient temperature to determine whether the fan will run or not. The downside to this application is that over time, our condenser coils may deteriorate or become dirty, and the head pressure may be higher than normal even on a cool day. Since this control is only looking at the ambient temperature and not pressure it will cycle the condenser fan off resulting in even higher head pressure. This control is usually only used when there are more than one condenser fan motors, and the control only shuts down one motor.

Another common control Would be a Discharge bypass valve Probably more commonly referred to as Headmaster Valve. This valve will automatically divert discharge gas directly into the receiver while simultaneously closing off the outlet of the condenser, this allows liquid to accumulate in the condenser coil causing the head pressure to rise by reducing effective coil space while using the excess liquid refrigerant in the receiver to feed the TXV. Once the head pressure returns to a normal range the valve will revert to normal operation where it will force all the liquid produced in the condenser coil into the receiver essentially refilling it. This action will repeat to maintain the required head pressure. This control is probably the most effective head pressure control and is effective down to -25°f. Something I hope never to see here. The downside is cost, the use of this type of head pressure control requires a significantly larger amount of refrigerant in the system to accommodate the low ambient conditions when we will need to have enough liquid available in the receiver and still be able to produce liquid in the condenser coil as well.

All three of the above controls are effective in maintaining head pressure to varying degrees but by far the headmaster is the best overall choice.


