

<u>First year instruction includes</u>: Safety, Math, Fundamentals of the HVAC trade, Gas Laws, Refrigeration Practices, Basic Refrigeration Cycle, Tools, Brazing and Soldering, Recovery and Evacuation procedures and EPA Certification.



TECHNICIAN'S CORNER

Direct Current in HVAC

Inverter systems are all the rage these days! Direct current (DC) voltage is being used more and more in higher efficiency systems and most mini split systems; we use this voltage to power components such as compressors, motors, controls, and sensors. In this month's article we will discuss a broad overview of how DC voltage is being used; although, this article is not written for any specific brand or model.

By using DC voltage through the printed circuit board we can change the speed of a motor (similar to a dimmer switch for a light). By varying the compressor and/or blower speed, the system can adjust to the actual load thus saving energy. Even on some 24-volt two speed systems equipped with an unloading scroll compressor; a bridge rectifier and DC voltage is used to shift the compressor unloader's position. Since this component is inside a hermetically sealed compressor the DC voltage to the unloader provides a "cleaner" voltage which is more reliable.

In HVAC systems that use DC voltage, the DC power source is typically a power supply that is converted from incoming alternating current (AC) voltage into DC voltage. The DC voltage is then distributed to various components throughout the HVAC system.

DC voltage works by providing a constant flow of electrical energy in a single direction. This is in contrast with AC (Alternating Current) voltage, which periodically changes direction (hertz). The constant flow of DC voltage is useful for powering electronic components that require a stable and predictable source of power. For example, DC motors can be

more efficient than AC motors in certain applications, and electronic components; components such as sensors and microprocessors operate more efficiently on DC voltage. An example of how this works; sending out a "source voltage" the board is programmed to look for a certain DC voltage. This signal manipulation done by resistance is translated into a meaning. For example, if a circuit board is monitoring superheat and it receives a 1.06 DCV back from the gas (vapor) sensor; the board reads that voltage (1.06) as 70°F (*reference chart to the left*). So, in this example we are using the DC signal as a computer language.

We should note that many HVAC systems still use AC voltage for primary power and rely on invertors or converters for powering DC components such as

compressors, fans, and pumps. DC voltage is typically used in higher efficiency units, mini split systems, as well as specific components within "standard" systems. On units equipped with DC compressors they are typically 3 phase motors. AC voltage coming into the machine is converted to DC and sent to the compressor as DC - 3 phase. This allows the compressor to modulate its speed by a DC control signal (back to my dimmer switch example).

As mentioned above DC voltage is used as a signal to and from sensors. In the HVAC field this ability allows the equipment to monitor pressures and temperatures (superheat, subcooling), entering air and discharge air temperatures. These systems also generate many types of error codes to aid in diagnosing as well as reminders for service.

HVAC systems may use DC voltage in various ways. Another example could be a control module receiving DC voltage from a power supply using it to operate a motor or actuator that controls a valve or damper in the system. Similarly, a sensor might receive DC voltage to power its internal electronics and enable it to measure temperature, humidity, and other environmental conditions.

Overall, DC voltage is a critical component of many HVAC systems, as it enables precise control and monitoring of various system components. Make sure you have a quality multi-meter to help in reading precise values and remember to be safe in all you do.

Palm Beach Air Conditioning Contractors Association will hold its 30th Annual fishing expedition Saturday, June 17, 2023 The Tournament will be open to all anglers.

Cash prizes will be awarded for the three largest fish in any or all of the categories: Dolphin, Kingfish or Wahoo, one prize per boat. More prizes will be announced the day of the "Captain's Meeting" on Thursday, June 15th, 2023 and end with an awards ceremony on Saturday afternoon.

1. **Captain's Meeting:** Thursday, June 15, 2023, 6 p.m. Location *Rafiki Tiki At the Riviera Beach Marina*

Mandatory for all Captains to attend. One person per boat please.

2. **Boat Check-in:** June 17, 2023 all boats check in with tournament committee 7 a.m. Call Pam @ 585-3880 or 308-8181.

3. Fishing Begins: Lines in the water at 7 a.m.

4. **Official Weigh-In:** Weigh-in begins at 12 noon all fish are to be weighed in at *Tournament Headquarters at the Rafiki Tiki at Riviera Beach Marina*, 200 East 13th Street, Riviera Beach. Boats must be in line and recognized by Official Tournament Weigh-in Staff no later than 4:00 p.m. (If in route, radio communication does not constitute being recognized.) Absolutely no fish will be weighed in from a vessel that has not been officially recognized by Weigh-in Staff by 4:00 p.m. Fishing stops and lines are out of the water at 3:00 p.m. All fish must be weighed-in directly from the vessel. Weigh Master has right to disqualify any fish for freshness. In case of a tie – the first fish weighed in wins.

All boats must adhere to the State and Federal required size and bag limit on the three tournament fish categories. A salt water-fishing license is required. Entered fish eligible for only one cash "place" prize per boat.

5. Fishing Stops: Lines out of the water 3 p.m.

6. Scales Close: 4 p.m.

7. Awards Ceremony: Immediately following at Rafiki Tiki at Riviera Beach Marina.

8. **Prizes:** First, Second and Third Largest Fish in any or all categories of Kingfish, Dolphin or Wahoo. *First Place - \$1000.00; Second place \$750.00, Third place - \$500.00, Cash Prizes limited to one per boat. There will be many other prize giveaways.*

Tournament Rules

- 1. Boat and anglers must be registered with PBACCA Tournament Committee. Late entries will be taken up to 7:00 p.m. Thursday, June 15th at Captain's Meeting. No exceptions.
- 2. Early registration fee is \$275.00 per boat for PBACCA members, Non-members \$325.00. Entries received after Friday, May 27th 3:30 p.m. are \$300 PBACCA members, \$350 non-members. Early registrations are eligible for the Captain's Party prize drawing.
- 3. Entry Fee includes 4 anglers per boat, 4 tournament T-Shirts, and 4 dinner tickets for Saturday, June 17th. Additional anglers are (\$50 before May 19th, \$55 after.) Additional dinner tickets for June 17th tournament ceremony may be purchased in advance for \$20 and additional T-shirts may be purchased at the Captain's Meeting for \$15 (as long as supplies last.)
- 4. Fish may be taken by rod and reel only. Down riggers and planers are permitted. No wire lines.
- 5. Dead bait, live bait or artificials may be used.
- 6. Chartered boats are allowed.
- 7. In case of a tie, the first fish weighed in wins.
- 8. Fishing hours are 7 a.m. 3 p.m.
- 9. If you have a fish on the line, beyond the lines out time you may continue to fish, but you must radio into the committee boat. Inform them of your boat number and circumstances. All boats are still required to be in line and recognized by Official Tournament Weigh-In Staff no later than 4:00 p.m.weigh in by 4:00 p.m. to be eligible for cash awards.
- 10. Tournament Committee will have the final decision.
- 11. All boats must adhere to the State and Federal required size and bag limit on the three tournament fish categories. A salt water-fishing license is required. Entered fish eligible for only one cash "place" prize per boat.
- 12. PBACCA has the right to cancel the tournament and return all entry fees if the 15-boat minimum has not been met by three weeks prior to the tournament date.




